#### **COVID-19 VACINATION RESIDENT BOOSTER**

A vaccination team will be onsite to administer the Pfizer vaccine for our Resident Winter COVID vaccination clinic (dose 4) which is scheduled for the 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of June. Residents who have completed their consent from and are eligible to receive either their first, second or third dose are also welcome to participate in this clinic.

Residents who have recently had the COVID illness and have consented to participate will need to be rescheduled to in accordance with the most current immunisation advice and The Good Shepherd Home will communicate with the Residents individual treating Doctor to plan for follow up of those Residents unable to participate in the clinic for this reason .

Immunisation advice confirms the 'additional winter dose can be given from 4 months or longer after the person has received their first booster dose, or from 3 months after a confirmed SARS-Cov-2 infection, if infection occurred since the persons first COVID-10 booster dose".

#### FRIENDLY REMINDER: VISITOR COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS

Thank you to everyone for assisting us to keep our Residents safe. Just a friendly reminder when visiting the Home to comply with the following;

- Do not enter if feeling unwell or displaying any common COVID symptoms (incl. temperature, sore throat, cough, tiredness, sniffles, vomiting, aches)
- surgical masks are required to be worn at all times this is essential given the frequency of positive cases where no symptoms are evident at the time of infection.
- please limit visits to small groups only (2-3max)
- please don't bring school age children where possible & utilise outside areas if children do visit
- practice hand hygiene and social distancing at all times
- hold visits in rooms, private patios, outdoor areas unless assisting at mealtimes in the dining areas

Multi-wing activities will continue to be limited until further notice although, small group activities within wings are permitted (no more than 10 residents to a group). Controls including seating plans are retained for all group activities.

#### RESIDENT ESCORTS

The Good Shepherd has historically offered an escort service to accompany and arrange transportation for residents to places outside of the home for purposes of health or medical appointments.

Due to the staffing difficulties within the home and across the health industry we are on occasion unable to provide this service and believe it is important that our care staff remain onsite caring for the residents within the wings.

We are seeking information regarding external services within the community to assist in transport and escort services however the assistance of resident relatives and representatives to fulfill this service would be appreciated.

#### FRIENDS PROJECT LAUNCH

Recently the Home held the Launch of the FRIENDS Project where external interested parties to Home attended a Cocktail party and were presented with an overview of the great opportunity.

The Friend Program is a joint research project conducted by researchers of University of Sydney and James Cook University involving residents and staff of the Good Shepherd Nursing Home.



The goal is to introduce a sustainable program that reduces frailty in the aged using a 3-pronged approach:

- 1. A high intensity exercise program using specialist gym equipment to ensure safe usage by our residents.
- 2. Improved nutrition through a focus on food presentation, the environment and social aspects of meals
- A planned reduction in medication that considers the impact of exercise and nutrition as alternatives so as to optimise the effectiveness of medications and reduce side-effects





#### Benefits to residents

Reduce the debilitating symptoms of frailty including regaining mobility and function leading to improved independence and quality of life.

The research project will operate over 6 months however through a placement program for Exercise Physiology students from JCU and the training of Good Shepherd staff, the recommendations of the Friend Project are expected to become permanently entrenched in the care of residents at the Home.

On completion, the research findings will be published and made available to other aged care facilities at no cost with the aim of introducing similar programs in Homes throughout Australia.

#### **Key Points**

- \* Sydney University donated gym equipment to The Good Shepherd value of approx. \$80.000
- \* 25 residents will participate in the initial research program.
- \* Currently 5 residents already participating in the exercise program under direction of Michael Inskip and JCU Exercise Physiology students.

#### **Business Improvement Fund**

Earlier this year, the Home was advised that our grant application for equipment and improvement projects was successful. In recent weeks some of the planned projects have started to appear around the home.


- A new nurse call system has been installed in Hibiscus. Work on a similar system has commenced in Riverview and will shortly be replicated in Mountainview. Additional cameras are also being installed in common areas in these wings to assist with resident supervision particularly at night.
- 40 new tablets have been installed throughout the Home to help care staff access Resident care plans and documenting.
- Orders have been placed for an upgraded WiFi across the Home. Some supply delays are holding up the installation, however we hope to complete this work by September/ October together with an increase to our internet bandwidth allowing residents greater usage.
- A contract for the supply and installation of a 250kw solar system for Pinnacles House has been signed. This system is estimated to reduce electricity cost by \$80,000pa. Work is expected to commence in October.

We'll keep you posted as these projects progress.
